Replacement skills instruction	Instruction in behavior(s) that serve(s) the same function as problem behavior and is intended to replace problem behavior	No review required	N/A
Positive reinforcement	The addition of a reinforcing stimulus following a desirable behavior that makes it more likely that the behavior will occur again in the future	No review required	N/A
Self-monitoring / self-management	A process intended to enhance self-regulation by teaching an individual to observe, monitor, evaluate, and/or reinforce his/her own behavior	No review required	N/A
Token economy based on positive reinforcement	A system of contingency management based on systematic reinforcement of target or desirable behaviors;	No review required	N/A

Redirection	Providing a reminder to a student about what he/she should be doing (e.g., where he/she should be, what the expectations are, the class rules, etc.)	No review required	N/A

Medication PRN	Use of medication prescribed by medical doctor, as needed, for management of behavior based on prescription	Prior PRC approval required with follow-up review each meeting. The nurse must evaluate and make the determination whether PRN medication should be administered.
