GET THE FACTS

The State of Delaware, the Christina School District, and the Christina Education Association are working together to focus on making changes that will raise the achievement levels of Wilmington students.

THE PROCESS

- Governor Carney, the Christina School District, the Christina Education Association, and the Department of Education are working to improve 5 of Christina's schools in Wilmington: Bancroft Elementary School, Elbert-Palmer Elementary School, Pulaski Elementary School, Stubbs Elementary School, and Bayard Middle School.
- We signed a letter of intent to work together and develop a partnership with the goal of improving educational opportunities in the City of Wilmington, and held town halls to hear from the community.
- We're working on a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to present to the Christina School Board that will:
 - Allow us to begin intensive work together to improve performance in Christina's Wilmington Schools
 - Outline the details of the agreement to be implemented in the 2018-2019 school year

OUR PRIORITIES

- 1. Empowering teachers to have more input on how resources are used
- 2. Addressing student achievement rates and increasing learning time for students
- 3. Giving school principals more control over decision-making
- 4. Creating trauma-informed classrooms that ensure safe, supportive schools
- 5. Addressing current facilities, including options to repurpose current school buildings in Wilmington
