Operations and Services

Facilities

- ESSER Grant funded projects Four larger projects are in design phase Brader ES HVAC System Replacement; Shue Medill MS HVAC System Replacement on Medill side; Jones ES Classroom HVAC Units Replacement; and, Kirk MS Head-end HVAC Equipment Replacement. We have completed several smaller projects using these funds.
 - The waivers before you tonight will allow us to treat these projects as Minor Cap type projects, condensing the construction schedule.
- Continuing our strategies to minimize the spread of the Coronavirus Upgrade of all of our filters in our Ventilation equipment; Increased fresh air exchange rates in all of our buildings; Installation of Sterionizers (air purification) in all of our buildings; and, treating surfaces with BioProtect.

Health and Wellness Christina's Back to School Guidance

Key Points

- Follow the Recommendations of the CDC by....
 - Use of face coverings, while indoors and on buses, regardless of vaccination status for all staff and students.
 - Maintaining at least 3 feet of physical distancing when at all possible
 - Monitoring and assessing ventilation systems
 - Screening testing for all students and staff
 - Educating and encouraging school communities on the importance of vaccinations
 - Ensuring best practices for cleaning and disinfection of surfaces
 - Contact tracing and quarantine strategies for close contacts
 - Promoting hand and respiratory hygiene
 - Use of a home health survey before coming to school
- Use of COVID/CRISIS Response Teams in All Schools
