# Operations and Services

## Facilities

- Demand Response, Energy Curtailment - We've had two successful tests demonstrating our ability to shed our energy consumption at our buildings. This program brings approximately \$150,000 into the District each year.
- Projects in progress - We have several projects currently underway - four at NHS, four @ CHS, three roofing projects, several HVAC projects, and plan to pressure wash the exterior of Gauger-Cobbs MS.
- Our biggest challenge right now is the long lead times on mechanical equipment due to the pandemic and other supply chain issues.

# Summer Programming

- 960 tutoring slots available for students in Grades K-12.
- Currently, 91% of those slots have been filled with room to grow. All students who have been registered have received a tutor and are engaged in one-on-one tutoring sessions, either in person or remotely.
- In terms of active participation:
  - 111 of the 170 Reading Assist slots have been filled (65%) Reading Assist is using this week to reach out to families and offer a virtual option.
  - 766 of the 790 Back to Basics slots have been filled either remotely or in person. (97%)
  - 877 out of 960 slots equals 91%

# CSD Virtual Academy

- We currently have a little over 630 families registered in grades K-12.
- We are currently assessing the applications, our current landscape and working on designing programming we can support.
- Signing MOU with CEA to aid in the staffing process for the Virtual Academy.
- We expect to notify families of next steps this month.

- Extended School Year-ESY and 12-Month Entitlement summer programming has begun.
- Special Services administration and staff have collaborated with special program leaders to develop summer vocational opportunities with community partners.
- Planning and preparation for the 2021-22 school year has continued to include potential support of identified 21yr old HB 128 students.
- All buildings/programs will continue to reinforce CDC, DPH & CSD guidelines so that instructional environments are safe for staff and students.
- Transportation department will continue to work closely with buildings to identify the most efficient pickup and/or drop off times to support student in class opportunities
