Operations and Services

Technology

- Since last update, CSD has received
 - o **744** laptops arrived for Staff
 - 48 Laptops arrived for Reach
 - 480 Cameras arrived for Staff
 - o **300** Power Strips arrived for classroom charging.
 - o 400 Hotspots
 - 20 laptops arrived for Bancroft Staff

Nutrition

- Providing remote meal access via bus delivery to high-need communities in addition to curbside pickup
 - o 21 curbside sites
 - 27 bus stop sites (11 buses in service for meals)
 - In person meal service for Cohort A&B
 - Delivery to classrooms for elementary schools
 - Grab & Go lunch for middle/high schools as students depart
- Breakfast and lunch meals are provided for free through 6/30/2021


PPE Updates

- School branded COVID signage deliveries are approximately 80% complete waiting on final directional sign deliveries.
- Nurse isolation rooms' medical partitions were delivered.
- Spray bottles have been distributed to teachers for classroom disinfection.

HVAC Updates

- In addition to the HEPA air purifiers that have been delivered to DAP & Reach classrooms throughout District, we have also delivered them for use in locker rooms.
- Sterionizer air purification units have been installed at the Brennen School. They have been ordered to be installed at CEEC, Maclary ES, Gauger-Cobbs MS, and GHS.



- Our committee is comprised of a diverse representation of our district stakeholders.

- We continue to meet weekly and operate as process observers for the work we've done, and the work to come.

CSD Community Feedback

DELTA

- Many of our transportation runs are spread across three different schools. Our transportation department is working to mitigate delays.
- There is still teacher concern around how to balance "Roomers and Zoomers."
- A combination of ending the marking period, beginning the return and moving to the Virtual Academy caused some overlap in systems and structures.
- We are still waiting on the shipment of more devices.
- There are still questions and concerns about health, safety and wellness as we reopen schools.

The Hybrid Return

- The Christina School District's plan for returning to school allows for a reduced number of students in buildings and classrooms, while providing a combination of in-person and remote learning.
- During the week of October 26th we have welcomed Cohorts A and B comprised of students in the following programs:
 - Delaware Autism Program
 - Delaware School for the Deaf
 - REACH
 - PreSchool (CEEC/SEEC)

The Hybrid Return

- During the week of November 2nd, we welcomed Cohort B of grades KN, 4, 5 & 6.
- During the week of November 9th, we welcomed Cohort A of grades KN, 4, 5 & 6

Upcoming phases:

- During the week of November 16th, we will welcome Cohorts A and B of grades 1, 2, 3, 7, 8 & 9.
- We will not add any new grades during the week of November 23rd.
- During the week of November 30th, we will welcome grades 10, 11 & 12

The Hybrid Return

- Members of our Superintendent's Cabinet and our Teaching and Learning team visit each school when welcoming a new Cohort.
- We've had the opportunity to observe/participate in arrival, meal distribution and to visit classrooms.
- We're maintaining an open relationship with the Christina Education Association and will partner with a select group of the bargaining unit as an advisory group and have them join some of our committee work as we forge ahead.

Learning Pods

- The Christina School District has worked with the United Way and other community partners to set up Learning Pods and other academic opportunities for our students during this much needed time:
 - The Neighborhood House Serving all students in the city of Wilmington and surrounding suburbs.
 - West End Neighborhood House Serving students who live in the city of Wilmington and attend The Bancroft School and Glasgow High School.
 - Teen Warehouse Slated to open soon! For students who live in Wilmington and attend The Bayard School and Christiana High School.
 - Girls Inc. Serving girls who attend The Bancroft School (located inside THE Bancroft School)

Learning Pods (cont.)

- Bear/Western YMCA Full-time Learning Pod open at Marshall Elementary School for all Christina students in grades 5-8.
 - The YMCA will also be opening hybrid sites for "Zoomers" at all of their locations. Viability of the site will depend on enrollment.
- Dual Generation Center Serving students who live in Wilmington and attend Stubbs Early Education Center.
- Red Roof Inn We have partnered with Representative Baumbach, Division of Health and Human Services and other community partners to open a Learning Pod for displaced families currently housed at the Red Roof Inn in Newark, DE.

Support Programming

We continue to make plans to support all students with enrichment and support programming:

- We are planning to launch Extra Time activities in all buildings in the form of virtual and face to face after school programming.
- We are currently partnering with FAME for a January launch of programming for students starting in grade 4.
- We are currently partnering with Upward Bound for a winter launch of programming for students in grades 6-12.
- We are currently partnering with the Christina Cultural Arts
 Center to bring arts into the classroom and extra-curricular space.

Adjusting and Adapting

We will continue to re-evaluate our hybrid plans based on evolving conditions, data about the status of the pandemic and recommendations/guidance from public health, state and local authorities.


