Created a comprehensive committee of New Castle County Public School Districts in conjunction with Delaware Public Health and Delaware Department of Education with the focus of safely serving special populations and medically fragile students.

CSDVA Model - Goals

- GOALS The Goal of the CSDVA is to implement a model that...
 - provides options for students/families who don't feel comfortable returning to face to face, F2F, instruction.
 - allows students and teachers to remain part of their home school and not isolated from that community.
 - maintains consistency with curriculum, instruction, and assessment. (Immersion, AAP)
 - allows students to receive the appropriate education and supports from their home school.

CSDVA Model - Goals

- GOALS The Goal of the CSDVA is to implement a model that...
 - maintains AP, dual enrollment, honors, and other specialty courses.
 - Career and Technical Education
 - Career Pathways
 - allows for flexibility and consistency.
 - allows for a transition that aligns with hybrid model and the end of the 1st marking period/beginning of the 2nd marking period.
 - allows for student success.

Elementary Model - Example

- CSDVA 1st grade classroom contains students from both West Park and Downes Elementary Schools.
 - a. Two Schools Collaborate to Provide Teacher and Services
- Elementary students will most likely have a new teacher when they transition to the Virtual Academy classroom.
 - a. Timing the transition with the end of the first marking period to ensure consistency with the report card process.

Secondary Model - Example

 - a. Students retain their current schedule and teachers

The Hybrid Return: Guiding Principles

- The Christina School District's plan for returning to school allows for a reduced number of students in buildings and classrooms while providing a combination of in-person and remote learning.
- Students will be assigned a cohort (A) or (B) and phased into their assigned schools for in-person instruction two (2) days per week. The other three (days) per week will consist of remote instruction.
 - Cohorts will attend school on Mondays and Tuesdays OR Thursdays and Fridays
 - Wednesdays will be a remote learning day for all students/programs as we deep clean our buildings between cohorts.



Start Dates

- Students will be assigned to either Cohort A or B for inperson learning.
- Cohorts will be phased in beginning October 26th.
- Each Cohort will receive inperson learning two (2) days a week.
- Each Cohort will receive remote instruction three (3) days per week.
