Operations and Services

Technology

- **6500+** Chromebooks have been delivered to schools. Deployment has started and expected to continue this week.
- **300** PreK iPads were delivered to CEEC and Stubbs along with cases and headphones (thank you to Friends of Christina for their generous headphones donation)
- **Hotspots** will continue to be provided to families along with the new Chromebooks as needed
- Additional technology resources: **Turn It In** for high school, **Nearpod** for K-12, and **Bark** for K-12

Nutrition

- Providing remote meal access via bus delivery to high-need communities in addition to curbside pickup
 - **21** curbside sites
 - 1 Newark evening curbside site
 - **27** bus stop sites (11 buses in service for meals)
 - In person meal service for Cohort A&B
 - Delivery to classrooms for elementary schools
 - Grab & Go lunch for middle/high schools as students depart
- Breakfast and lunch meals are provided for free through 6/30/2021

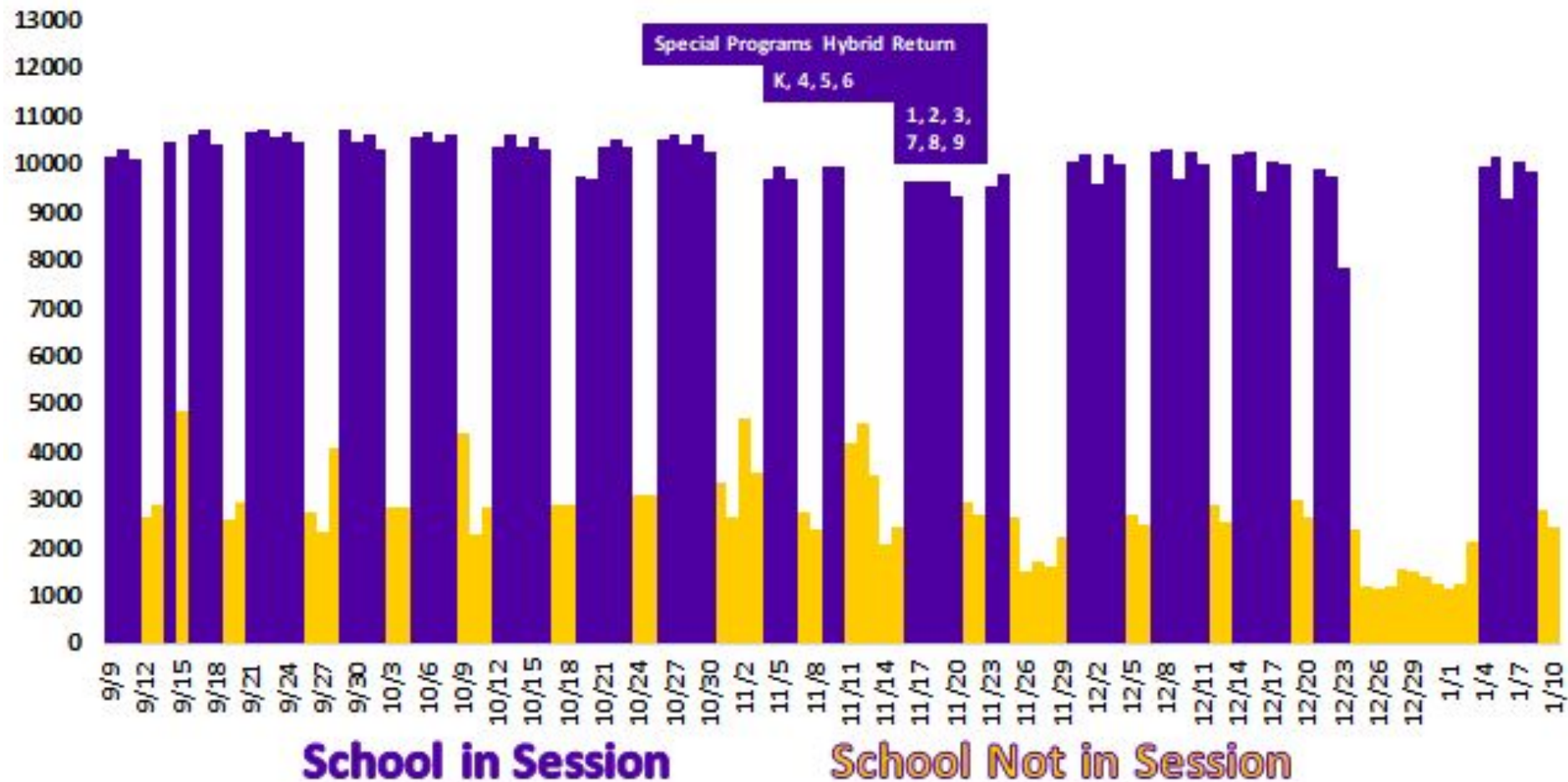

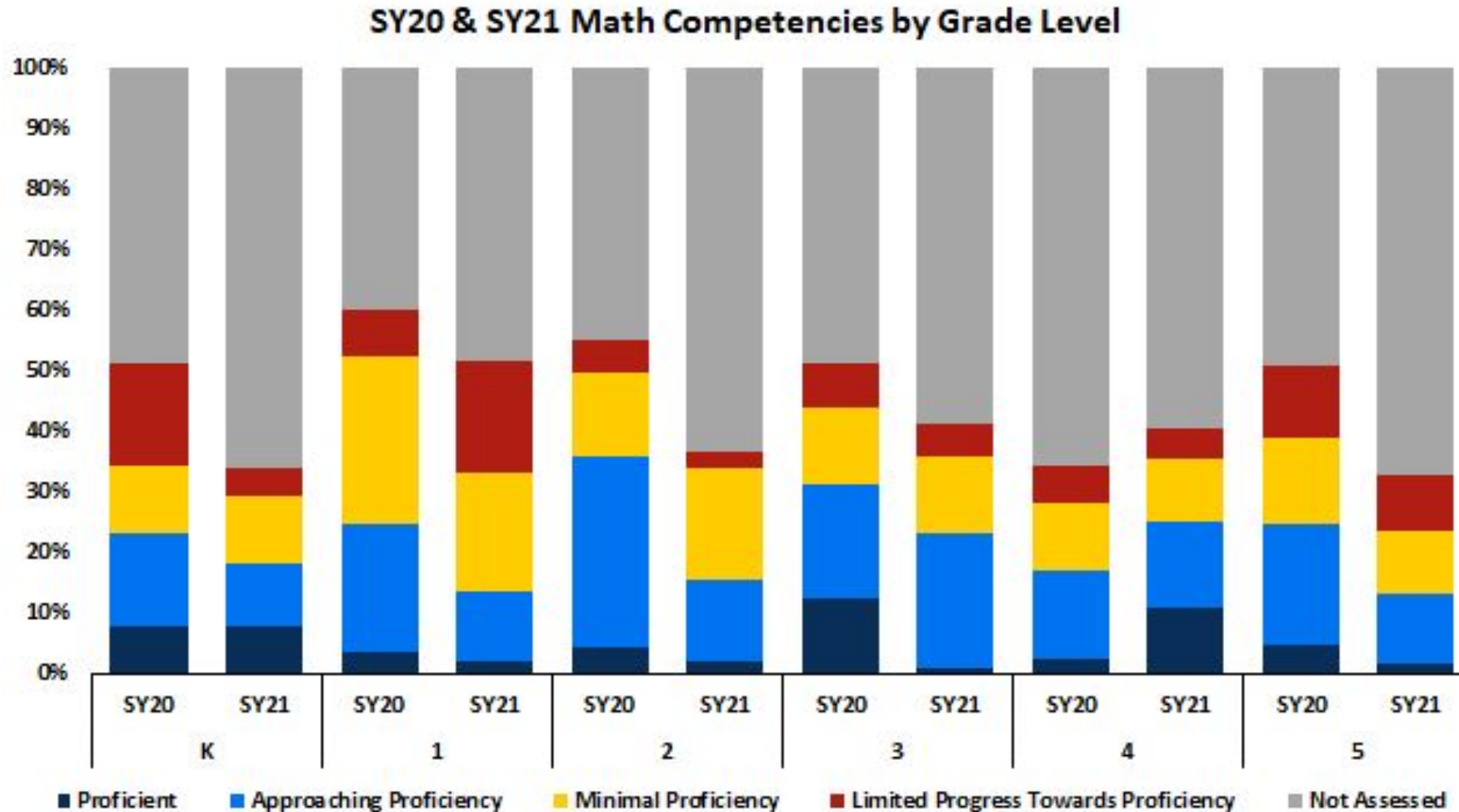

SY21 Active Schoology Count of Students by Date

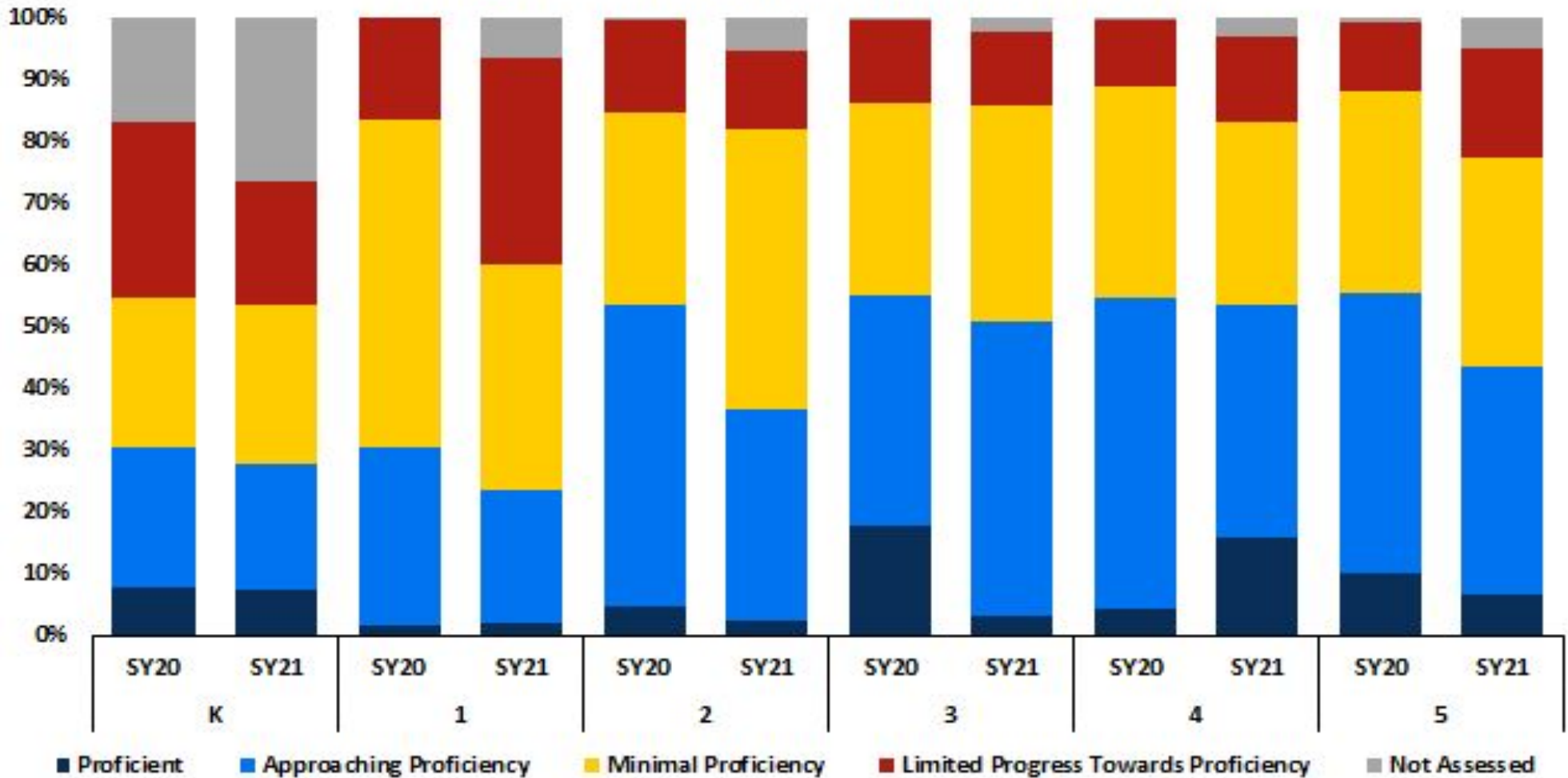


Elementary Math Competencies by Grade Level



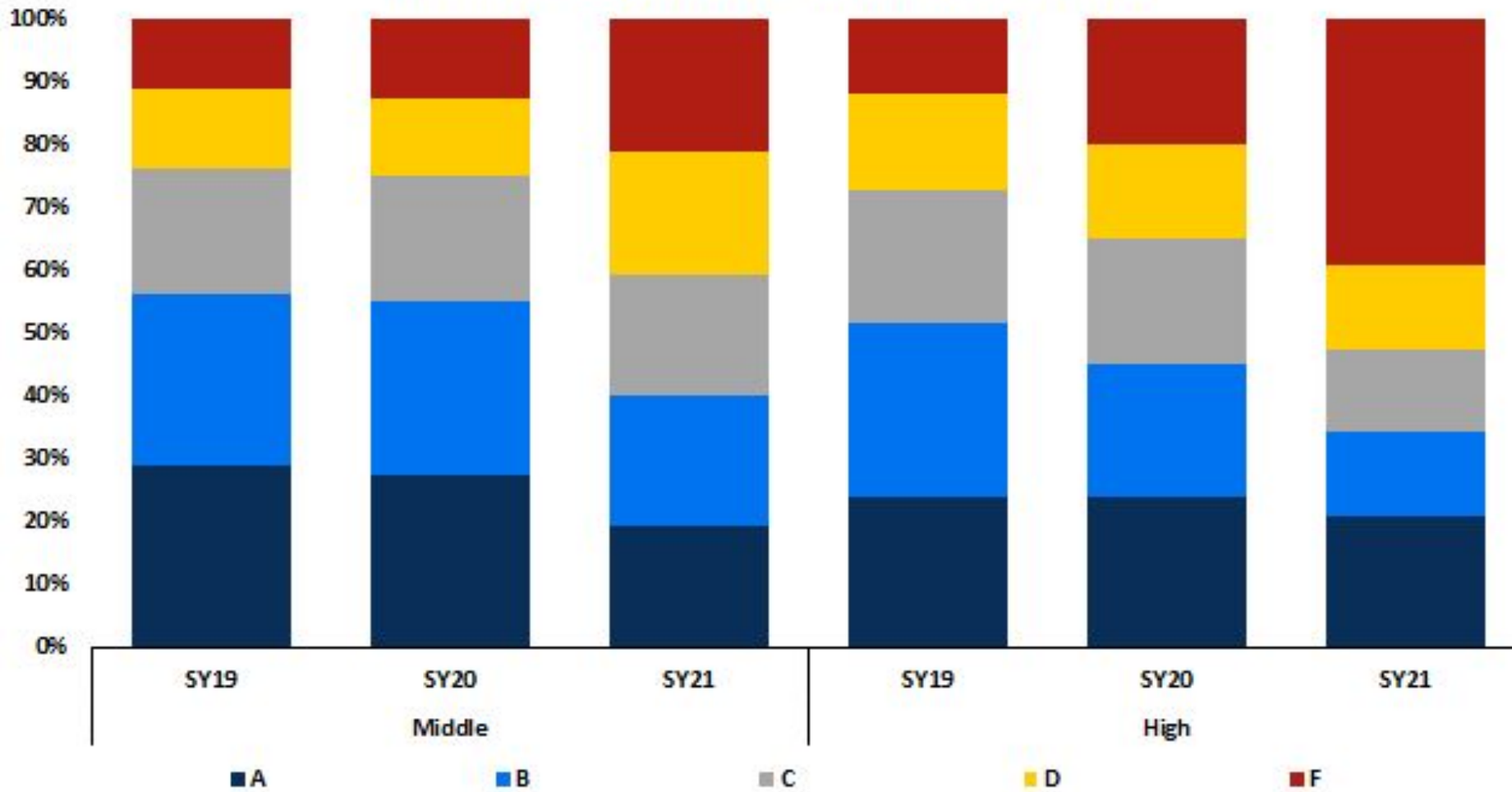
Elementary ELA Competencies by Grade Level

SY20 & SY21 Reading Competencies by Grade Level

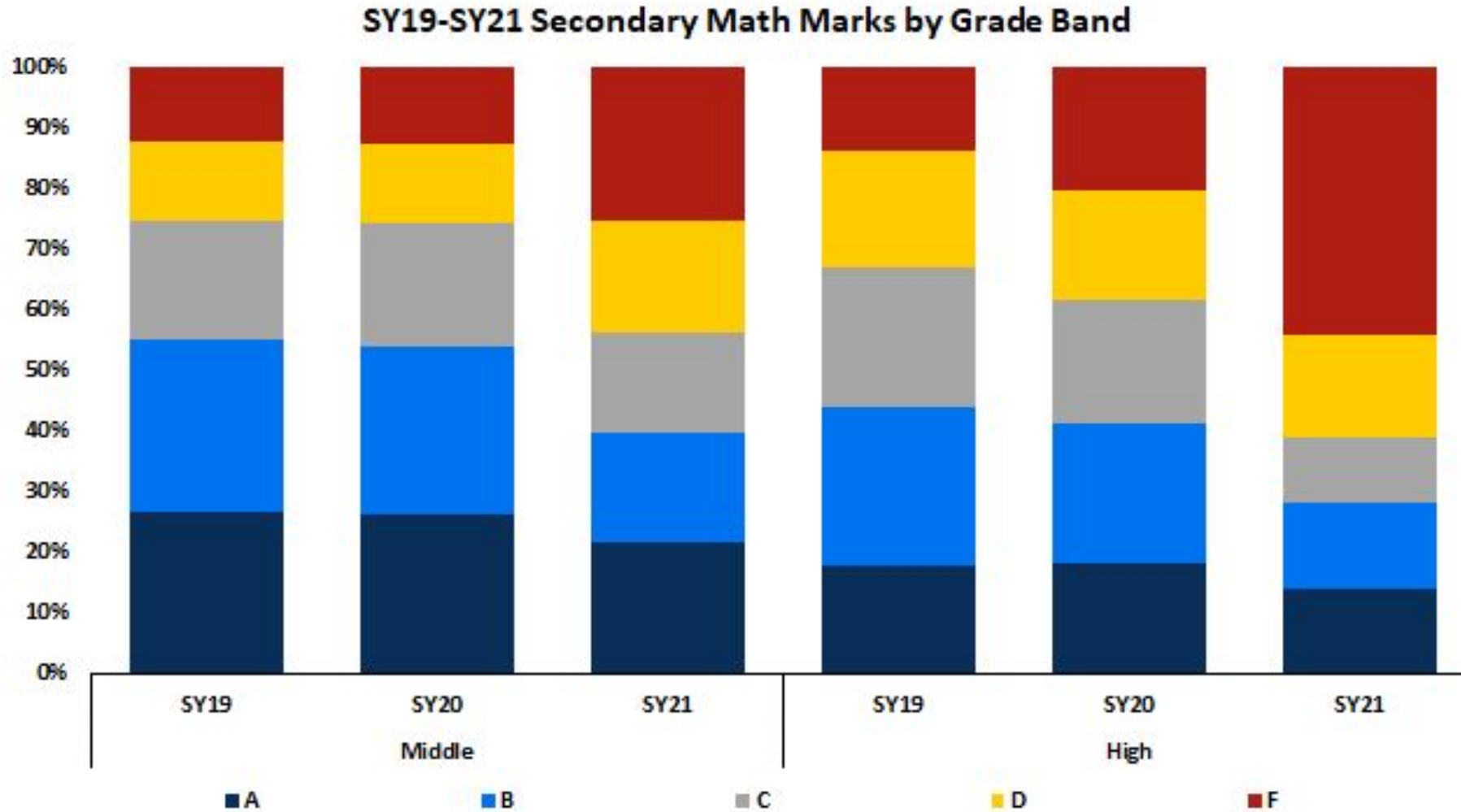


Secondary ELA Marks by Grade Band

SY19-SY21 Secondary ELA Marks by Grade Band

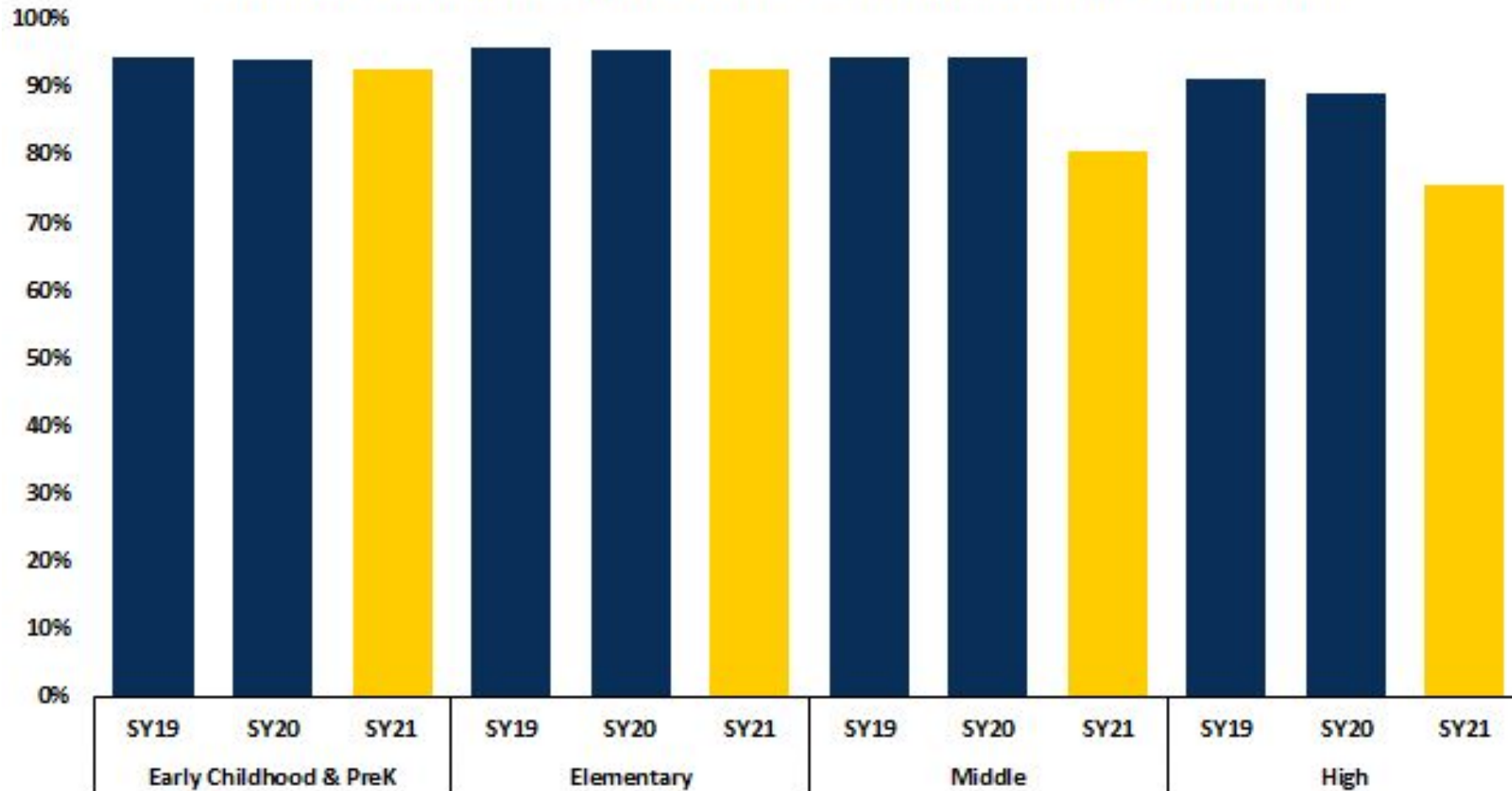


Secondary Math Marks by Grade Band

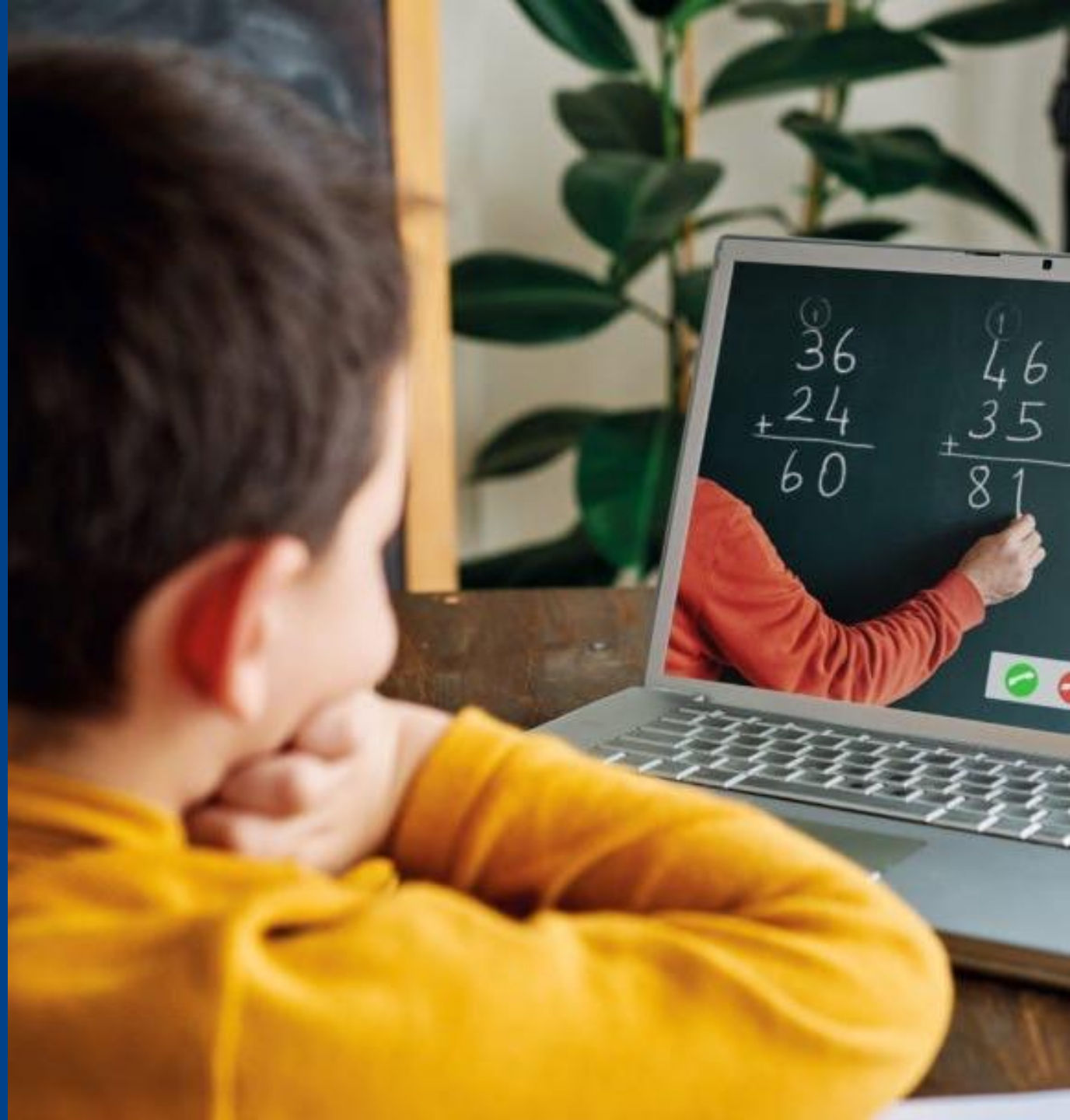
