Facilities

- Adibots - The UV producing, disinfecting robots have been delivered to their respective schools and the custodial staffs have been trained on operation.
- RFP - We have contracted with 3 of our 4 A/E firms to begin the design work to renovate the HVAC systems at Brader ES, Shue-Medill MS, and Jones ES. We are currently defining the scope of work and negotiating the fee for the replacement of the HVAC equipment @ Kirk MS.
- Sterionizers - We are starting the installation of the Group III (12 schools) Sterionizers this week.

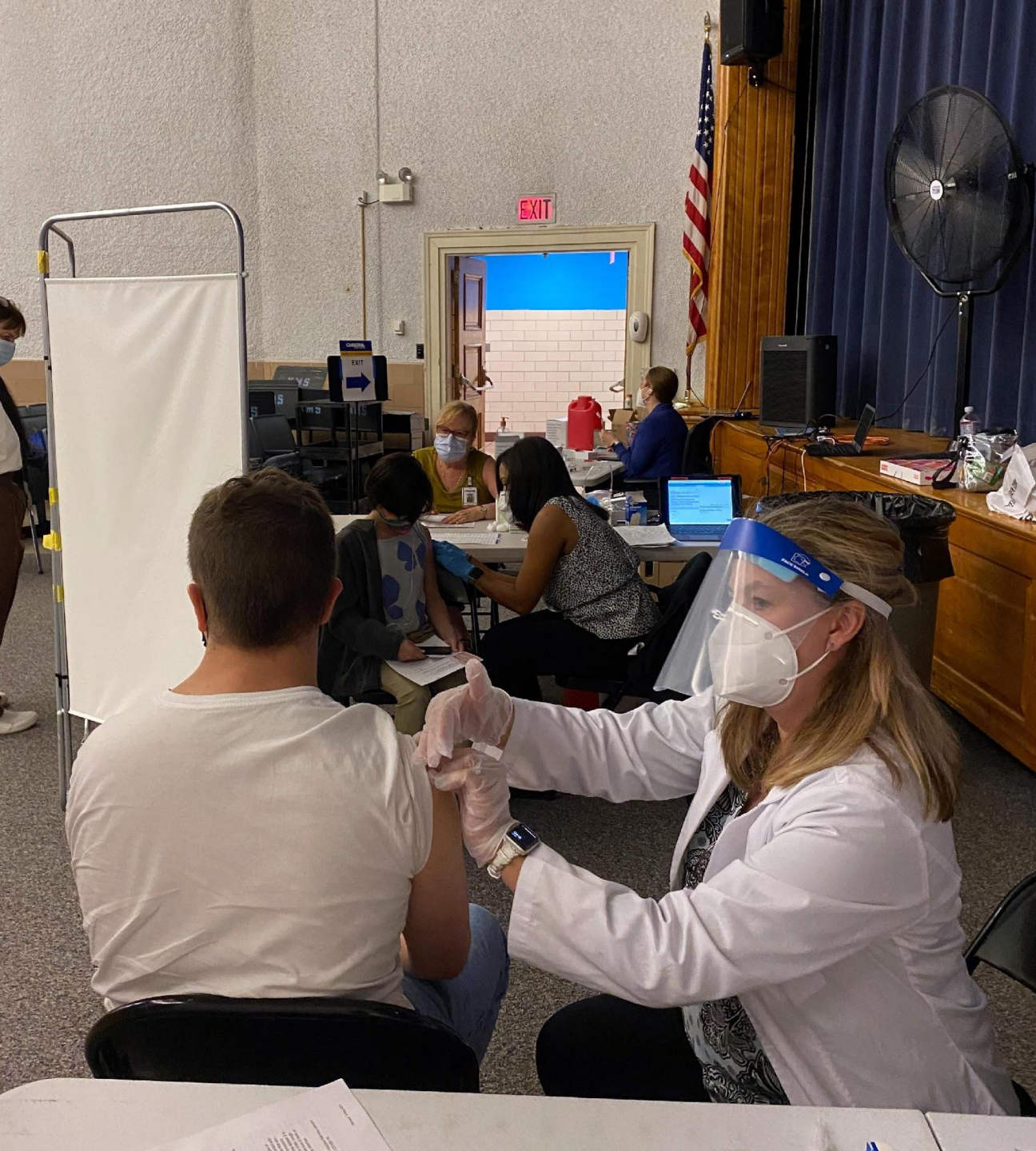

Special Populations Update

- Planning and preparation for Extended School Year-ESY and 12-Month Entitlement summer programming has been finalized.
- Sixteen buildings across the district will host ESY and/or 12month summer school opportunities.
- Special Services administration and staff have collaborated with contracted district partners to develop summer programming for students who currently receive outside agency support.
- Eligibility determination evaluations will continue during the summer months so that potential areas of academic need are identified.
