

Principal's Message

Subject: Important Updates for Gauger Cobbs Families

Good Evening Gauger Families,

I hope this message finds you well. Happy Holidays and Happy New Year to all our Gauger Cobbs Families! It's hard to believe we're already heading into 2025 but the New Year is just around the corner. I pray that you have a healthy New Year, and we look forward to serving your child at GCMS.

I have a few important updates to share: End of Marking Period 2

As we approach the end of Marking Period 2, the midpoint of the school year is just around the corner. It's essential for students to stay on top of their "Summative" assessment grades, which account for 70% of their overall grade. The remaining 30% comes from "Formative" assessments. Summative assessments include unit tests and major projects, while Formatives typically consist of quizzes or classwork assignments. All formative assessments are designed to help students master the content and succeed in their summative assessments.

Please remember that we have a test/retest policy. If your child does not do well on a summative assessment, they should work with their teacher to schedule a retest opportunity.

I encourage families to discuss grades with their children and reach out to teachers via Home Access Center or Schoology if you have any questions or concerns.

New Marking Period Rotation (MP 3)

After the end of Marking Period 2 on January 24, 2025, we will begin the rotation for Marking Period 3 starting on January 25, 2025.

What is Advisory Class (daily 7:10 - 8:10 am)?

During Advisory Class students work on Organizational skills (Binders & Binder Checks), test taking strategies, study skills, Time Management skills, general support for Math and ELA classes, and character and social development lessons.

One intention for Advisory Class is to build a community within the group; this time is focused on helping students gain skills/habits to increase success in their academic courses through our implementation of <u>AVID</u> strategies and utilization of lessons from <u>Second Step</u> to support students in their social and emotional growth. During Advisory Class students will be asked to set goals, plan out steps for meeting those goals, and reflect on their progress towards meeting those goals. Through community circles students have an opportunity to learn more about their classmates and discuss various topics to hear different perspectives. Students are also afforded the time to work on the online platform <u>iReady</u> – students take a diagnostic assessment three times a year and depending on their results the program will design an individual pathway to address gaps in their understanding or topics to be furthered explored to stretch their understanding of a topic.

Gauger-Cobbs Middle School starts each day with Advisory Class, students are asked to go to their lockers and then report to Advisory Class. Students have time to finish up their breakfast while morning announcements are shared via intercom (Tuesdays and Thursdays) or through <u>GMAP</u> (Gauger Morning Announcement Program). Then students are asked to participate in different activities depending on the day of the week. This is the same classroom where students return at the end of the day to store their binders for the next day.

Why are we sharing this with you? First, we know what an important influence you are on your student(s) and their future and we wanted to share with you some of the activities we are providing to help support their journey to becoming productive learners and leaders in the global community. Hopefully students have been sharing some of the activities/conversations they are engaging in during Advisory Class. We are also asking for your support in encouraging students to take advantage of this Advisory Class to set goals and work towards achieving them. Students should come to Advisory Class with their Chromebooks charged, headphones to participate in the iReady program, a willingness to engage in developing positive relationships within their school community, and an understanding that Advisory Class is an opportunity to support their growth in academics, emotional, and social growth.

Nurse Contact Information

If your child has any of the symptoms below, please keep them home and send in an illness note upon their return to school.

- Sore throat
- Cough
- Shortness of breath, trouble breathing, severe wheezing
- Chills or shaking with chills
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- New loss of smell or taste
- Congestion, runny nose
- Fever of 100.4F or above

If your child is experiencing **ANY** of the symptoms above, have them tested (home tests acceptable) for COVID before returning to in person learning to assure the health and safety of the school community. *Please be mindful that a fever is not a common early symptom for COVID and is not the sole indicator of COVID-19.*

- Death in immediate family
- Contagious disease in the home
