It is our nursing team's goal to partner with you and the staff at Gauger Cobbs Middle School to keep your students healthy, safe and ready to learn. Please make sure your student gets a good night's sleep and eats a healthy breakfast each morning. We do offer breakfast each morning in school as well. If possible, please send your student to school with a personal water bottle. Nutrition and hydration play a huge role in keeping your student healthy & on task in school. #### **HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL**

Students who are entering Gauger Cobbs Middle School as a first time student to a Delaware Public School must have a physical exam (within 2 years), up to date immunizations, and TB risk screening (within 1 year) submitted to the school nurse. <u>This is a Delaware law; if noncompliant, your student will be excluded from school until the documents are received.</u>

#### Medication

Christina School District guidelines regarding medication: **All medication must be brought to school and picked up from school by a parent/guardian.** All medication must be in the original container and prescription medication must be labeled for your student. This is a state law; therefore, noncompliance will result in your student not receiving the medication at school. Asthma/Allergies/Seizures/Diabetes

Action plans are required to be updated yearly by their physician. All students with known diagnosis of asthma, allergies, seizures, or diabetes should have their inhalers/nebulizers, Epi-Pens/Auvi-Q, Diastat, insulin and any other needed supplies brought into the nurse's office prior to the start of school by parent/guardian please.

#### **Health Screenings**

Orthopedic (postural/gait/scoliosis) screenings will be given to all Gauger Cobbs Middle School students. Vision & hearing screenings will be given to all 7th graders. These screenings will be completed at the beginning of the school year. If your student fails their screenings, we will mail home a letter recommending an evaluation by their physician.

#### **Illness/Sickness**

All students going home due to a health issue must be evaluated by a school nurse first. The school nurse will contact the parent/guardian and the student will be sent home from the school nurse's office. Students should not text/call/email their parents asking to be picked up from school. Use of their personal cell phone is in conflict with the code of conduct.

It is important to note that this award is different from the State of Delaware Behavioral Health Professional of the Year Award. School counselors are eligible for both awards, but each is overseen by different entities and has different requirements. The attached chart outlines some of those similarities and differences.

## School Counselor of the Year vs. Behavioral Health Professional of the Year Comparison DSCA

School Counselor of the Year Award

**State of Delaware** 

Behavioral Health Professional of the Year Award

- Process is managed and overseen by the Delaware School Counselor Association.
- Only School Counselors can be nominated.
- The nominee must hold a Master's Degree or equivalent in Guidance and Counseling and be certified as a school counselor by the State of Delaware.
- The nominee must be a full-time practicing school counselor at the time the individual is nominated and must have completed at least five years of service as a school counselor in a PreK-12 setting.
- The nominee must be employed by a school/school district.
- The nominee must be a current member of the Delaware School Counselor Association.
- Three finalists are selected from the nominees who completed the nomination requirements. They are announced at the annual Celebration and Recognition Dinner in February.
- Delaware SCOY Winner is announced at the DSCA Spring Conference.
- Delaware SCOY Winner is nominated for the ASCA School Counselor of the Year Award.
- Finalists each receive \$500
- The School Counselor of the Year receives an additional \$1,000
- Process is managed and overseen by the Delaware Department of Education.
- Eligible candidates are school employees whose position is health care practitioner or social
  or human services provider who offers services for the purpose of improving an individual's
  mental health such as: school counselors; social workers; licensed clinical social workers;
  school psychologists; and school nurses.
- The nominee must be employed by a school/school district or charter school.
- Each school district in the state selects one individual as their District Behavioral Health Professional of the Year. One nominee shall represent all of the Charter Schools.
- All the Districts' BHP of the year will be nominated for the State of Delaware BHP of the Year award.

- State of Delaware BHP of the Year is selected annually through a process developed by DDOE.
- Individuals who are chosen Behavioral Health Professional of the Year for their respective school districts will be awarded \$2,000.
- The individual who is chosen state Behavioral Health Professional of the Year shall be awarded \$3,000 in addition to the district level award.
