
Uniform Policy

SCHOOL HOURS

Regular School Hours are 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

After school clubs and activities throughout the year. We will offer sports activity buses again this year, which will provide free transportation home for students participating in activities and will depart at GCMS 4:00 PM. Unless a student is with a teacher, there should be no students in the hallways or classrooms after 2:15 PM.

Parent Drop-Off/Pick-Up Information

Upon entering the campus in the morning and afternoon, student drop-off (a.m.) Pick-up (p.m.) vehicles will turn into the school from the Broadfield Drive entrance located in Scottfield Neighborhood.

Parents will proceed to loop around the circle lot and drop off students near the flagpole and continue moving to keep traffic flowing. No parents should park in the lane and or sit idle. It is expected that parents drop and immediately move out of the fire lane. They will then loop around and go back out in the same direction.

This plan ensures parents will not have to be in the same traffic pattern with staff or buses.

All buses will be coming in at the Gender Road entrance so please avoid this area. We will have staff members in the drop-off lane for the first week of school to help with the process.


Absence notes:
