Honors Academy English 10 Summer Reading Assignment

All students enrolled in Honors Academy English 10 for the 2020-2021 school year are expected to complete the following assignments over the summer break:

- Read I Will Always Write Back: How One Letter Changed Two Lives by Caitlin Alifirenka & Martin Ganda and Outliers: The Story of Success by Malcolm Gladwell
- > Complete the Dialectic Journal Assignment for each text due Wednesday, September 30, 2020.
- > Select at least one additional book to read on your own, and be prepared to discuss the text for class.

Dialectic Journal Assignment

As you read, keep a dialectical journal for **each book**. You should write these journals in one notebook, using both sides of each page as directed below. DO NOT TYPE YOUR JOURNALS!

How to set up your Summer Reading Journal:

- Page 1
 - ✓ Put a formal heading starting on the top line, in the top right hand corner of the first page of the notebook including: your name, Honors Academy, Honors English 10, Mrs. Tuminaro.
 - ✓ Write the title of the assignment (Summer Reading) in the center of the page on the first line below the heading.
 - ✓ Skip a line. Write a correct APA reference citation for both books, in the order in which you will be journaling the texts. Skip a line between each citation and be sure to begin each citation at the margin, indenting subsequent lines only.
- Subsequent left pages should be divided in half. You can do this by drawing a line, folding the page, or simply minding your own imaginary margins. Whichever method you choose, keep your columns neat. Right pages will not be divided.

- ✓ For the QUOTE ANALYSIS column (left pages), on the left Notebook Page (the first will be on the back of page 1), write the quote word for word from the text, followed by the page number in parenthesis. Select a quote or passage from the reading that uses particularly poignant language and/or exemplifies the author's style. Write your response and analysis of the quote on the left side of the page. Select at least 10 from throughout the text.
- ✓ For the RESPONSE column (right pages), you have several ways to respond to a text and you only need to use one way. But, be sure to use a variety of response techniques when journaling (you should use all six techniques at least once during the process for each text. Responses should be at least two well-developed paragraphs (7+ sentences each) in length. You should have ten entries for each book.
