Principal's Message

Greetings Kirk Families and Friends,

It was a great first week of school and has been so wonderful to see our students back in school and online in the Virtual Academy. I enjoyed seeing familiar faces and meeting new students this week. Our students did so well this week both in school and online.

This past week we held our welcome back assemblies Inperson and online to review expectations with our students. One of the messages I stressed was the difference between

school in 2019 and now in 2021 and how we must minimize disruptions to focus on learning.

Our goal is to create a safe learning environment for all our students so that they can focus on their education and social-emotional development. We want our students to be excited to come to school and learn.

This week we will begin distributing Chromebooks to our students. In-person students were provided with copies of the 1:1 agreement (along with emergencies cards) that need to be returned in order to receive their devices. As the signed copies are returned we will begin to distribute devices to students. If any CSDVA student still needs to pick up their child's device please contact the office (by phone or email) to set up a time to pick up your device.

I also would like to apologize to anyone who has difficulty getting through to the office. Our phones have been going in and out. We have had Verizon looking into this matter. We are also working to get an emergency cell phone line in the event they are unable to repair the issue in a timely manner. Once we receive that number I will be sure to share that with you.

Important Information:

- <u>Chromebooks (In-Person students)</u> will be distributed in school during the first two weeks
 of school. The CSD Technology Agreement must be signed by both a parent and student
 to receive their device. The Technology Agreement is attached and will also be distributed
 to students in school.
- <u>Chromebooks (CSDVA students)</u> Chromebook Distribution was held August 31st. If you
 were unable to make this date please contact the office to schedule a time to pick up
 your device.
- <u>Antigen Testing</u> Rapid COVID testing will again be provided at school for registered students and staff. More information is included in this newsletter.



Antigen Testing Information & Consent Form

Christina School District, in partnership with the Delaware Department of Education, Delaware Public

Health and Quidel Corporation, are offering the implementation of a Rapid COVID-19 Testing

Program. Like last year, registered students and staff will participate in weekly testing for the presence of COVID-19. These tests, similar to a rapid strep test, provide results in as little as ten minutes.



Christina School District began offering this service in January 2021. We are excited to continue to

offer this mitigation strategy for the 2021-22 school year. Christina School District will use the following process to administer the tests:

- Students/families must opt in to the testing program by completing the COVID-19 School Testing consent form. A copy is provided with this letter. The electronic consent form can be found at https://my.primary.health/l/christina-schools
- Students, with approved consent, will be screened weekly while in school. Testing will be provided and administered by Quidel Corporation. Sample collection will be completed in a matter of minutes with a nasal swab. The student and family will be notified of either a positive

or negative result and the next steps required. Quidel will also send email notifications for all test results on a secure online portal for individual/parent review.

To participate in COVID-19 antigen testing, we ask that you complete the COVID-19 test consent

form by visiting our website https://my.primary.health/l/christina-schools or by scanning the QR code

below. Please contact your child's school nurse if you have any questions regarding the antigen test.

Message From The Superintendent: Dr. Shelton

Dear Christina Families,

Christina School District (CSD) continues its effort to keep everyone in school, excelling in the classroom and participating in extracurricular activities.

At Christina, we have learned that there is no challenge too great if we work together. The fact that we are starting the new



school year entirely in person is an important new phase in our battle against the coronavirus. However, continuing to increase our vaccination rate will move us to the next phase, where all school activities can resume.

As we prepare to welcome kids back to class on Wednesday, September 8th, our schools are ready to provide the extra academic and mental health support students will need. We are also ready to bring back treasured traditions of school life that were delayed by the pandemic. I hope you will join me in recognizing how far we've come since the start of the pandemic and looking to the new school year with enthusiasm, excitement, and hope.

We need your help. We are asking that everyone practice mitigation strategies in order to continue offering in-person learning.

MITIGATION EFFORTS

CSD's mitigation efforts continue to evolve as Delaware public health officials provide new guidance. However, our comprehensive mitigation plan demonstrates our commitment to maintaining a healthy and safe learning and working environment for our students and staff.

As previously communicated, the plan to keep our schools safe includes, but is not limited to, wearing a face mask indoors, hand washing, staying home when sick, contact tracing in combination with quarantine and isolation, and cleaning and disinfecting.

Frequent testing continues to be a major mitigation measure. To that end, please sign up your child, regardless of vaccination status, for weekly Antigen testing. Those families who participated last year will again need to register for testing. To register your child(ren), please visit our website or by scanning the QR code below.

As a reminder, CSD has invested in upgrades and improvements to our HVAC systems, which included higher-rated, linked type, HVAC filters. The district also purchased and installed Sterionizer air purification systems and the highly effective ADIBOT disinfection system that utilizes UV-C technology that quickly and efficiently disinfects the air and surfaces from harmful pathogens, including COVID-19, MRSA, and influenza.

All these efforts, along with numerous others, are key to providing a healthy and safe learning environment for our students and faculty/staff.

STAY HOME WHEN SICK

As a partner in helping keep classrooms and schools COVID-free, it is imperative that your child stay home when they feel ill. This is an important step in helping to keep our students, faculty/staff, and community healthy.

We ask all students to perform a <u>daily health screening</u> before coming to school each day. **If your child answers yes to any of the above questions, they are expected to stay home**. We ask the parent/guardian to report the absence to the school.

It is equally important that a parent/guardian notify the school if your child has had a positive COVID-19 diagnosis and/or has been in close contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19.

MASKS

The CDC and Delaware Department of Public Health continue to promote the use of masks as one of the top mitigation strategies to slow the spread of COVID-19. We strongly recommend that everyone follow the advice of health experts by wearing a mask while indoors in public spaces. Inside of our buildings and on school buses, masks are required regardless of vaccination status.

COVID-19 VACCINATION INFORMATION

According to the CDC and Delaware Department of Public Health, vaccines continue to be another top mitigation strategy to stop the spread of COVID-19. Health experts at the national, state and county levels agree that the vaccine is an effective and powerful tool that dramatically reduces your chances of getting COVID-19. Additionally, increasing the vaccination rate in a community is a key factor in reducing the spread of the virus.

- There are COVID-19 testing sites throughout Delaware. Find a location near you now. We must all work together to make our schools as safe as possible for students, faculty, and staff. While CSD is taking measures to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19, we need our families to do the same. Engaging in Christina's mitigation strategies increases our chances of continuing to provide a world-class learning experience in person. It also increases our chances of our students being able to continue participating in athletics, clubs, and other extracurricular activities.

Kirk Middle School will be one of the first schools in the country to utilize the ADIBOT-S disinfection robot. The highly effective ADIBOT disinfection system from global robotics leader, UBTECH, utilizes UV-C technology that quickly and efficiently disinfects the air and surfaces from harmful pathogens, including COVID-19, MRSA, and influenza. This is done without the use of harsh chemicals.

We are now selling Kirk facemasks as a school fundraiser. Our new masks are made of high-quality materials that include a durable liner with an opening for a filter and adjustable ear loops.

Our new mask will be sold in the front office during the school day for \$5.00 (cash only)
