Two Models: **Hybrid** and Virtual

The HYBRID Model

- The Christina School District's plan for returning to school allows for a reduced number of students in buildings and classrooms while providing a combination of in-person and remote learning.
- Students will be assigned a cohort (A) or (B) and phased into their assigned schools for in-person instruction two (2) days per week.
- The other three (days) per week will consist of remote instruction.
- Cohorts will attend school on Cohort A-Mondays and Tuesdays OR Cohort B-Thursdays and Fridays
- Wednesdays will be a remote learning day for all students/programs as we deep clean our buildings between cohorts.

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The HYBRID Model

- **Learning:**

- Teachers will create Zoom links and present all lessons synchronously and face to face
- Teachers will only have to present the material one time and will further progression in the curriculum
- Attendance taken for all
- The camera focus is on the teacher and the instruction, not the class/students

- **Office Hours/Small Group Instruction**

- Allows for small group instruction, interventions, enrichment and office hours

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Cohorts / Cohorting Process:

- Students will be assigned to either Cohort A or Cohort B
- Cohorts depend on SEVERAL factors: bus capacity (23), siblings and those that live within same household, classroom capacity, special education services, English language services, etc.
- Cohorts have been assigned. This information will be coming to you in the mail. It should arrive to your home no later than Tuesday, November 2nd. We will also send a parent link with this info beforehand.
- Due to the highly complex system of factors that cohorts depend on, requests to modify cohorts will not be able to be accommodated.
- Leasure cohorts have between 10-16 students at this time.

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Dates of Return:

- Kindergarten, Grade 4, and Grade 5:
 - Cohort A: Return **November 9**
 - Cohort B: Return **November 5**
- Grade 1, Grade 2, Grade 3:
 - Cohort A: Return November 16
 - Cohort B: Return November 19
- Two Important Notes:
 - When one cohort is not physically in school, Zoom instruction will still take place.
 - Your child will still be “learning remotely” until it is their designated phase in date to return on site.

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School Day / Hours:

- Modified School Hours as set by Christina School District:
- Leasure 9:00 – 2:40
- Doors will open at 8:50 Students are late after 9:10
 - * Specific Arrival and Dismissal Procedures will be shared as the return date approaches.
- Dismissal begins at 2:40.
- Buses will begin leaving Leasure approximately 2:45.
- Buses are cleaned after EACH run. Students sit in family groups, and will sit every other seat in a staggered fashion to ensure social distancing.

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What to Expect On-Site in the Hybrid Model:

- Safety Precautions:
 - Desks facing same direction, 6.5 feet apart.
 - 3-4 feet in all walkways/aisles.
 - Hand Sanitizer and antibacterial soap in the classrooms / bathrooms / around the school.
 - Signs to remind students about COVID symptoms and proper hand washing and face coverings.
 - Grab-& Go Breakfast/Lunch in the classroom. Lunch meals delivered to the classroom. Students can bring their own lunch. Masks can be removed. Hands washed B & A.
 - 30-minute recess periods during the day – masks will be worn. Students will need to remain 6 feet apart. Hands washed B & A.

Two Models:
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What to Expect On-Site in the Hybrid Model:

- Learning Models:
 - Academics continued both on-site as well as remotely over Zoom.
 - Small group instruction can continue – masks used, Intervention, Supportive Instruction, Special Education Services, English Language Learner Services.
 - Specific Class Schedules will be announced closer to the reopening.
 - Schedule will look different than it does now, and will mimic a traditional day in school.

Two Models:
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The Structure of Wednesday:

- Combination of Instruction that is Synchronous (same time) and Asynchronous (not at the same time)
 - This schedule will begin the first Wednesday after your GRADE LEVEL begins in hybrid mode (regardless of your cohort)
- Office Hour with teachers
- Deep cleaning of the building

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School-wide Impacts:

- Hybrid - All Leasure Teachers
- VA – Leasure and McVey Teachers
- Some teaching hybrid and some teaching VA.
- This could mean that your on-site teacher (teaching in the hybrid model) may be different.
- Letters sent home to this effect – will arrive by Monday.
- Class Cohort sizes vary - between 10-16 students at this time.
- Classrooms large enough to fit at least 15-16 students using the social distance requirements.

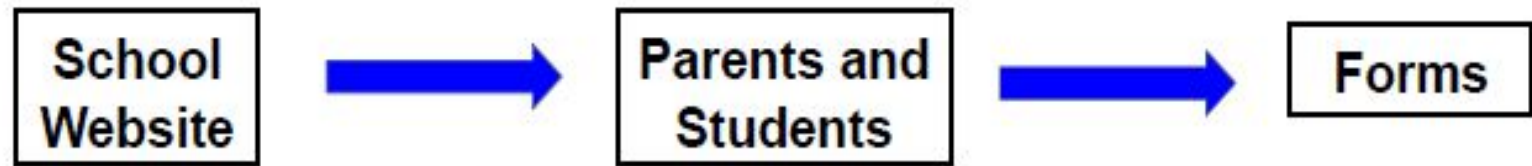

Important Requirements

Every morning before you send your child to school, please check the following:

1 In the past 2 weeks, has your child tested positive for COVID-19 or is s/he required by DPH to isolate or quarantine?

2 Does your child have any symptoms of illness such as:

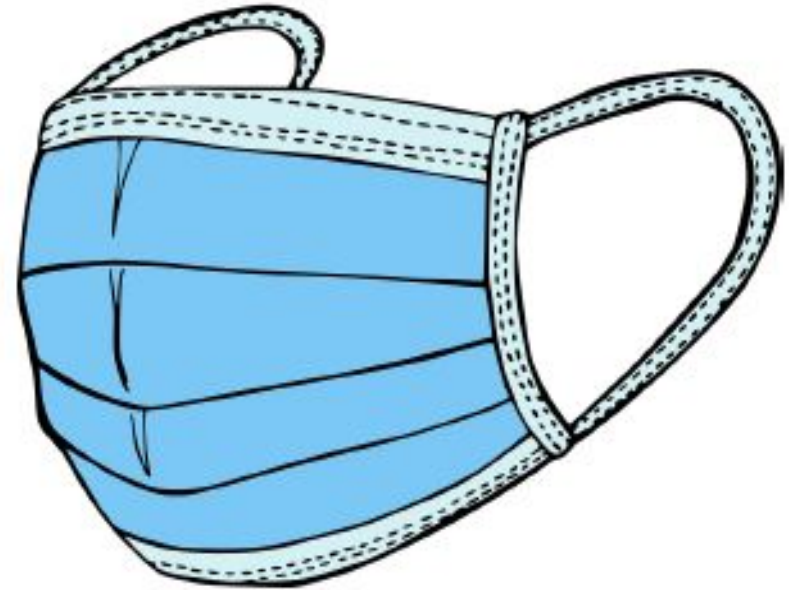


3 Within the last 2 weeks, has your child been in close contact (within 6 feet for more than 15 minutes) with anyone confirmed with COVID-19 or had direct contact with their mucus/saliva?

➔ If you answered YES to any of the above questions, **DO NOT** send your child to school today. Please contact your child's health care provider and your school nurse:

Important Requirements

- Covers Mouth and Nose
 - Loops Behind Ears or
 - Ties Behind Head
 - No Bandanas/Gaiters
- Buses and School Campus
- Removed Only During:
 - Meals
 - Hydration
 - **Recess** (School Dependent Based on Size of Playground and Ability to Social Distance)

HOME TEST KIT

This method of testing is available to Delaware residents only. Division of Public Health encourages any Delawarean over the age of 60 to utilize this testing method.

The at-home testing option utilizes saliva collection, which has the same effectiveness as the oral swab test. This is not a nasal swab test. This test is performed under the supervision of a Vault healthcare provider through a video telehealth visit, eliminating the risk of person-to-person exposure to the virus.

Notification of Positive Cases

Dear Parents/Guardians and Students:

We learned today that a staff member/student at [school] has tested positive for COVID-19. This person will not return to school until the isolation period has passed. Anyone who has been in close contact with him/her as determined by the Division of Public Health (DPH) is being notified by our partners DPH and may have to isolate/quarantine before returning to school. Individual decisions on isolating/quarantining are made by DPH epidemiologists, in consultation with the affected individual and school nurse.
