<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Make sure that the Clever and iReady app are on the home screen.</li> <li>2. If it is NOT, go to the SELF SERVICE app and download BOTH apps.</li> <li>3. Open the CLEVER app.</li> <li>4. Click LOG IN with USERNAME and PASSWORD</li> <li>5. Click LOG IN THROUGH ACTIVE DIRECTORY (NOT clever)-this will take you to the State's lighthouse page that students are familiar with.</li> <li>6. Log-in student username and password (same as Schoology()).</li> <li>7. Click on iReady.</li> <li>8. It will ask you "Open this in I-Ready?" Click open. It will automatically open the iReady app.</li> <li>9. Now, at this point it will probably come up with a warning: "This app wasn't built for this iPad or the iOS version, so some features may not work as well..." Click on the ARROW to continue anyway.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. DOWNLOAD BOTH the Clever and iReady app from the app store.</li> <li>2. Open the CLEVER app.</li> <li>3. Click LOG IN with USERNAME and PASSWORD</li> <li>4. Click LOG IN THROUGH ACTIVE DIRECTORY (NOT clever)-this will take you to the State's lighthouse page that students are familiar with.</li> <li>5.
