



What is Project DELITE?

The University of Delaware has been awarded a National Professional Development grant by the US Department of Education for **Project DELITE (Delaware English Learners' Impact on Teacher Education)**. Under this grant, we will provide a route, **at no cost**, to Teacher of English Learners or Bilingual Teacher certification for 60 educators and 15 paraprofessionals over the next five years.

Project DELITE is also a research study to investigate the impact of certification on educators' knowledge, beliefs, and practices. To produce reliable results, we will assign participants randomly among three cohorts, starting classes in Summer 2023, 2024, or 2025. You cannot choose your preferred cohort due to the research design.

What does participation involve?

- Five online graduate courses from the University of Delaware over 14 months
- All textbooks are provided
- Praxis II (ESOL) test (a score of 149 or higher is required for EL Teacher certification)
- One year of support in a Professional Learning Community (PLC), leading to a capstone project presentation at the annual Delaware Multilingual Learner Conference
- A \$250 stipend for each year of participation and data collection

What are the classes?

The five courses are required for EL/Bilingual certification in Delaware:

- 1. Summer 1 (5 weeks, June-July): LING 676, Second Language Acquisition & Bilingualism
- 2. Summer 2 (asynchronous plus office hours): EDUC 740, Literacy for English Learners
- 3. Fall (semester): EDUC 672, Methods of Teaching English as a Second Language
- 4. Spring (semester, starting in February): LING 677, Structure of English
- 5. Year 2 Summer (5 weeks, June-July): LLCU 624, Second Language Testing

In addition, participants who do not hold a Delaware teaching license will participate in the Alternate Routes to Certification seminar (6 Saturdays in July and August), the cost of which will be covered by the grant. Participants may be eligible for a Delaware teaching license after the program; additional requirements apply.

Who can participate?

Participants will be teachers and specialists who already work with multilingual students and/or those who are looking to move into immersion or ESL specialist positions. The program is suitable for teachers of all grade levels (K-12) and all subject areas.

Paraprofessionals from Delaware's multilingual and immigrant communities are especially welcome. You may be able to earn a full teaching license through a partnership with Alternate Routes to Certification (ARTC) at UD.

All participants must be currently working in a Delaware public K-12 school and plan to stay for the duration of the project. You must have direct contact with students, including multilingual learners.

How will participants be selected?

We will invite participants on the basis of:

- Potential impact on multilingual learners in the applicant's context
- Experience working with multilingual learners
- Motivation
- Diversity and proficiency in non-English languages

What is the timeline?

Participants who are accepted and complete the consent form will be randomly assigned to Cohort 1, 2, or 3 in mid-March 2023.

 - **February 10**: early deadline for applications
 - **February 27**: final deadline for applications
 - Successful applicants will be invited to complete a consent form and confirm participation. Please complete the form within 10 days of receipt.
 - Mid-March: participants will be randomly assigned to Cohort 1, 2, or 3.
