KINDERGARTEN

This week we focused on the letter Oo, Ozzie Octopus. We learned new sight words- make and play. We played two math games, Spin and Count Shapes and Hungry Caterpillars. The children are so excited about the spring celebration next week. Keep up the great work!

1ST GRADE

This week in Reading we will be on Lesson 23, and will be reading a whimsical story by famous author Ezra Jack Keats, Whistle for Willie. In this story, Peter wants to call to his dog, Willie by whistling, but he can't whistle. He practices during the story in various places and finally learns to whistle at the end of the story. Our comprehension strategy will be on cause and effect. Our phonics focus will be on vowel diagraphs oo (moon, soon). In grammar we will learn about simple verb tenses. In Math, we will be working on number corner March activities, and strategies for addition and subtraction to 20. Please remember to have your child bring the weekly packet to school, along with his/her device (and be sure it's charged). Please remember to complete daily homework assignments as well.

2ND GRADE
