CSD Parking Application and Regulations

In order to successfully apply for a “parking permit,” each student applicant in 11th or 12th grade must provide a copy of his/her valid license, registration and insurance card with the district application and submit it to the Main Office of your current high school for processing and evaluation.

1. A student must be in good academic standing for a permit..
2. There is a \$20.00 non-refundable fee upon assignment of a parking slot.
(Money order or cash)
3. Students with an unmet obligation from previous years will not be issued a permit until the obligation is met and a receipt for clearance provided.

THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY:

CSD Parking Application and Regulations

1. Parking permits must be hung from the rearview mirror of the car with **permit numbers visible from the outside** through the windshield. The permit number must match office records for the vehicle assignment. Lost or stolen permits **cannot be replaced** for the current school year.
2. Park in the assigned parking slot. Written principal permission is required to park in any other location not designated to your vehicle. Unauthorized parking or repeated parking violations may result in the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense.

3. Speed limit is 10 mph and all vehicular laws apply.
4. Student drivers must wait for all buses to exit. Cutting in front of buses will result in loss of privileges.
5. Be responsible for all persons in my vehicle.
6. The District presumes a student possesses and is therefore responsible for items in the student's motor vehicle. Student understands motor vehicles brought on campus are subject to search.
7. Students and passengers are not allowed on campus before 7:00 a.m. without permission from a teacher/administrator.
8. If my vehicle breaks down, it is not an excused tardy or absence.
9. Students must have adult permission from the office to go to their car during the school day.
10. Leaving school grounds is a violation of the "Student Manual" and will be handled according to the matrix.
11. Student must refer to and abide by conditions outlined in the "Student Manual."
12. Disciplinary action with an assigned suspension may result in the loss of driving privileges.
